 - Would like to start a committee to look into the disconnect of members leaving. Discussion continued. Would like two members from each company on the committee, no disrespect, but he would prefer non-officers. Please take this back to the firehouses for discussion at the next meeting. He and Commissioner Miller to also sit on committee, but they want the information to come from the membership.

King

- Thanked Joyce for her patience in assisting the Board with budgetary items and moving money as necessary.
- Co #3 501C3 paperwork was sent out to the accountant. Vice President McGowan noted that Co #2 received their 501C3 status last week; copies of paperwork to be forwarded to Joyce. Brief discussion continued.
- AFG grant still not released.
- Cautioned that the TIC camera on the mask can very easily be left on and run the batteries down.
- Reminder to have your people check their LOSAP points so they are not surprised at the end of the year!

Miller

 Would like to implement exit interviews with those firefighters that resign, if they are willing to participate; will need the help of the officers to make this successful. Brief discussion continued.

Sadousky

- Life member of Co #1 requested access to the firehouse; Co #1 voted not to grant access. The Board is going to respect the wishes of the company, but it is the responsibility of Co #1 to notify that life member. Asked D/C Chouinard to let the President or Vice President know to take care of this.
- o At a previous meeting the Board was told that the radios would be returned to

the apparatus, yet there was a call the other morning and portable 294 responded when Co #4 wasn't assigned to the call. Questioned who is portable 294. It was noted that it was Lt. Ramsey. Commissioner Sadousky noted that he is in violation of Chief's order 01-2016. Discussion continued; A/C Bullard was asked to get together with D/C Bogardus and Chief Burwell to rectify this situation and report back to the Board at the next meeting.

Recently there were two searches, one person allegedly had a hand gun, and although we always try to assist the police, he is concerned that the members are potentially being put in harm's way as they are not armed or protected. Lengthy discussion continued, including whether or not our assistance was requested. D/C Ellsworth noted that for the Co #3 search, the Sheriff's department made it very clear that they would not have requested assistance if circumstances had been different. He and Chief Burwell were thoroughly updated throughout this call. A/C Bullard noted he believes that they were requested to assist with the school evacuations. Commissioner Sadousky requested serious discussion by the senior leadership regarding this safety issue and that maybe an SOP needs to be created.
