GFD New Office Building Design

The GFD is currently designing a new office building to meet the storage and office requirements of our ever changing fire district. The hope is to start construction late summer or in the fall and the project will be publically bid as per district practice. The new facility will be located on current district property - adjacent to the Greenfield Center firehouse. The design committee gives a report monthly at each GFD workshop.

Porter Corners (Company #2) Renovation Project Finished!



The GFD is putting the finishing touches on a nearly 2 year remodel construction project at the Porter Corners firehouse. The firehouse had some structural issues and water foundation issues that were corrected as part of this remodel. In addition, the firehouse got new windows, new insulation, and a new more maintenance friendly exterior.

Rehab Bus and Fire Police Van

The GFD members have completed two key initiatives that add strategic capabilities to the fire district. Last year, Time Warner Cable graciously donated a van to the fire district and ARC (Saratoga Bridges) graciously donated a bus.

The van was turned into a district fire police vehicle which is dispatched to any major incident or motor vehicle accident which requires traffic control. Nearly all of the labor was provided by GFD fire police personnel, who did body work, paint preparation, light and radio installation, and equipment installation to get the vehicle into active service.

Starting in January, there were new NFPA requirements established for firefighter rehabilitation during fires, and there is a Saratoga county-wide rehab protocol. With these new standards, members of the Maple Avenue fire company solicited a bus from Saratoga Bridges with the goal of creating a rehabilitation unit. Saratoga Bridges graciously agreed, and firefighters spent nearly 6 months designing and building the rehabilitation unit. Nearly all the labor to complete this project was done by firefighters including: custom welding, body work, paint preparation and painting, installation of lighting and reflective striping, and a kitchenette.





Middle Grove Firehouse Roof Replacement

The GFD is actively researching the replacement of the Middle Grove firehouse roof. The old original roof had been fixed and patched numerous times over its lifetime, more often in recent years - and has since reached the end of its life. As part of an effort to improve upon the original firehouse roof design, all of the service penetrations previously run through the roof will be relocated to the eastern (rear) gable end. This should improve roof performance and ultimately extend roof life expectancy and maintenance.

Saratoga and North Creek Railway Now Operational

The Saratoga and North Creek Railway is now operational, beginning Saturday, July 23, 2011. Please be cautious and careful when approaching railroad crossings, especially when the crossing arms are down, as the rail tracks throughout the Town are now back in service after years of inactivity.

New Firefighter 1 **Graduates**

In order to be certified as a "Class A" firefighter, members of the GFD have to take the NYS "Firefighter 1" course - which is designed to be the bare-minimum training for a firefighter. "Class A" firefighters are permitted to wear a SCBA and go inside a burning building. This course is nearly 90 hours and spans nearly five months of classes.
